As a first step, as required by the Foundation, Penn is convening a university-wide committee to nominate a single individual to submit a letter of intent. If you wish to apply, **please submit the following items to Maria Crudele (**mcrudele@pennmedicine.upenn.edu**) by Friday, August 26**<sup>th</sup>, following the instructions in the <u>RFP</u> exactly. Applications are welcome from faculty in any department of any school at Penn.

1. A three-page, single-spaced letter of intent, with one-inch margins and font size no smaller than 12 point, that includes:

- A description of the research proposal, particularly its significance
- How the research will be carried out and how it is likely to have an impact on clinical, biomedical, and public health decision-making, policy, and practice
- A personal statement describing the applicant's goals in the field of bioethics

2. A CV, no more than five single-spaced pages

If you are selected as the nominee, the committee will then work with you to refine your letter for submission to the Foundation by the September 19<sup>th</sup> deadline.
